

Paraguayan Advanced Network Arandu were presented at the iLearning Forum, an event that took place in Paris, France and called for international delegations interested in learning, education technology providers and representatives of European universities.



The achievements so far in the advanced network of Paraguay, Arandu, and the importance of connecting to CLARA, were presented to representatives from over 40 countries attending the event iLearning Forum Paris 2011.

The forum was held on 1 and 2 February at Le Palais des Congres in Paris and once again demonstrated by their ability to call, one of the largest in Europe in the field of technology and e-learning.

With exclusive presentations and demonstrations for VIP public and open demonstrations for more than 5000 visitors, the activity brought the latest innovations in e-learning, such as interactive video, games, management applications and social learning networks.

The second presentation was aimed at a group of educational technology providers and representatives of European universities.
